COMMUNITY NOTICE

Warren Farm & Talacre Beach Activity

Please be advised that there is ongoing construction activity at Warren Farm. From Saturday 29th August, there will be an increase in activity on Talacre Beach as survey and ground investigation works are undertaken during periods of low water spring tides. During this time, you may notice additional vehicle movements, equipment and associated noise at both locations. Please keep clear of the work areas.

Both works form part of the second phase of the Point of Ayr Cable Route Foreshore Works, involving the installation and burial of a combined electrical and fibre-optic cable optic cable between Talacre Beach and the New Douglas Offshore CCS Platform in Liverpool Bay.

PoA Terminal Decommissioning and Construction Activity

Decommissioning and construction activities are underway at the Point of Ayr Terminal. Works are also ongoing within the surrounding Colliery area with an increase in site activities and vehicle movements.

Please be advised that, **until end September**, a light beam will be used within the Terminal boundary to sensitively discourage birds from entering the decommissioning works area during the nesting season.

During this period, you may notice a green beam visible on site each night from dusk until dawn. The beam will follow a mapped route around the decommissioning areas within the terminal site and will be positioned to point down at the ground at all times.

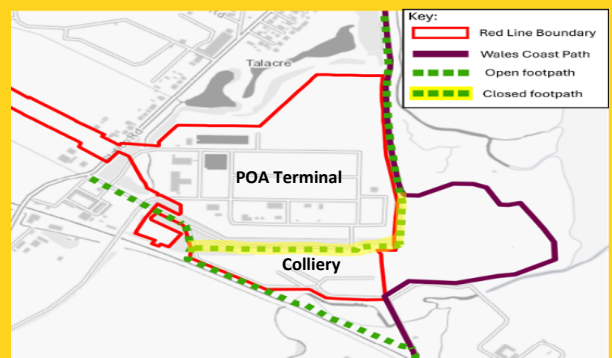
Up until the end of 2026, subject to project progress, piling activities will be carried out inside the Terminal. You may notice an increase in noise levels, site activity and vehicle movements.

All activities will take place **Monday to Friday from 08:00 to 18:00** and **Saturdays from 08:00 to 13:00**, with an additional hour either side for site preparation and close-down. You may also see unmanned aerial vehicles ('drones') operating within the Terminal boundary but no noise is associated with them.

Temporary Closure of Public Right of Way

The public footpath (highlighted in yellow on the map) is temporarily closed, following approval from Flintshire County Council. The route, which runs between the Point of Ayr Terminal and the Colliery, has been securely fenced off as a safety precaution to protect the public from the ongoing work on the Colliery, and ensure the safety of the workforce undertaking the activities ongoing in this area.

While the path is closed, an alternative route (shown in green on the map) is available along the railway line, reconnecting with the Wales Coastal Path. Clear signage has been installed to guide walkers to the alternative route.
