



COMMUNITY NOTICE

Temporary Closure of Public Right of Way

From 1st March 2026, Flintshire County Council has approved the temporary closure of the public footpath (highlighted in yellow on the map) that runs between the Point of Ayr Terminal and the Colliery.

The footpath will be closed and the Colliery area fenced off to allow works to take place safely and securely. An alternative footpath (in green on the map) is available along the railway line and will connect to the Wales Coastal Path while the Colliery footpath is closed. Clear signage will be installed to direct people to the alternative route.



PoA Terminal Decommissioning and Construction Activity

Decommissioning and construction activities are underway at the Point of Ayr Terminal and surrounding Colliery area. You may notice increased site activity, including noise, vehicle movements and lighting. Works are taking place Monday to Friday from 08:00 to 18:00, and on Saturdays from 08:00 to 13:00, with an additional hour either side of these times for site preparation and close-down. You may also see unmanned aerial vehicles ('drones') operating within the Terminal boundary but no noise is associated with them.

Warren Farm and Talacre Beach Activity

Please be advised that there is an increase in construction activity at Warren Farm and Talacre Beach. During this time, you may notice increased vehicle movements in and out of the area, with associated construction noise and equipment. From **Wednesday 25th February** construction work will require **12-hour days**, while other activities will commence over **24-hours** to ensure the project is completed safely and as quickly as possible. The **24-hour** working period is expected to last for **approximately four weeks**, subject to project progress.

Invasive Non-Native Plants Clearing Works

Please be advised that Cotoneaster clearing works continue on the Colliery. During this time, the affected area will be fenced off to manage the invasive non-native plant.
